Pastor Bobby's Post

"The More Things Change; the More they Stay the Same."

Chuck Colson writes in his book, Being the Body, "Most writers do not retreat to solitary cloisters to ponder great thoughts and then, in glorious moments of illumination, compose timeless prose. No...They begin with what we read and study and think about; they are influenced by thinkers and mentors as well as the trials and joys of personal experience." I go through phases of thought processes, and I am not sure what precipitates them. Recently I have been reading Michael Grant's, History of Rome. My studies have confirmed what I knew all along. I have come to reaffirm what we confess each Sunday from 1 John 1, "If we say we have no sin we deceive ourselves and the truth is not in us..."

The history of Rome was one of violence, conflict, greed, and avarice. Rome's history was all about false pride and power. Remarkable among the Romans were those called "orators." I read some of their speeches and no one ever told them that, "brevity is the soul of communication." They went on and on and on... And it was all about, whose side they happened to be on. The speeches in the Roman Senate surely sent the rest of the senators to "la-la land."

Rome's history is all about war with their neighboring "city states" and making alliances with those who could help them rule the Italian peninsula. I read there were more wars in the 20th Century than the rest of history put together. I don't know how true that is, but it seems feasible to me. M. Cherif Bassouni, an atrocitologist (one who studies atrocities), calculated 203 million people died due to battle, internal conflicts, and outright wars. Add that to 29+ million abortions in the U.S. Friends, Jesus words ring in my ears from John 14:27, "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled and do not be afraid."

Legal abortions in the past 60 years, according to Pew Research, are 37,200,000. That does not include abortions not reported. If those babies had lived how would that fundamentally change America today? Wow, that thought is staggering.

Obviously, most people in the world have not listened to and heeded these words of the Messiah. Fear not, there is a way out of all this madness. Jesus said in the Gospel of John 14, "I am going to prepare a place for you..." The history of this world is truly disgraceful. The only grace we find is in the Cross and Resurrection of Jesus. Yet, this is exactly what is taught in our secular universities. Namely, "secular humanism" taught in our academia tells university students there "is no God" and that humans are getting better and better at taking care of each other. They say humans can handle all their own problems and that humanists will make this world a better place.

I say, "Balderdash" and "humbug" to worldly ideologies. So then, what is the hope of the world? It is all summed up in one word, "Jesus." And that is the truth and the whole truth...nothing but the truth.

Now, go and do and be the People of God.

The congregation enjoyed conversation, family photos and lots of cake in joyous celebration of the difficult studies and faithful commitment of these six young students. We are so proud of them!


